## WYLLIE LECTURE AND MEDAL

The Wyllie Lectureship and Medal was founded in 2023 in honour of the late Professor AH Wyllie, former President of the Society, who died in 2022 and was the "Father of Apoptosis".

The Wyllie Lecture and Medal will be given to an active early stage or mid-stage pathologist researcher who is making seminal contributions to pathological science and the understanding of disease mechanisms.

Such individuals may or may not be Members of the Society.

## Ordinances

1. The Wyllie Lectureship and Medal shall normally be awarded annually.

2. Any Member of the Society may submit nominations to the General Secretary in the form of a 300 word Citation using the nomination form available on the website.

3. Nominations must reach the Society by the 1 March or 1 October. Please send nomination forms to: operationsmgr@pathsoc.org by 1 March 2024 for the Summer Meeting of 2024 or by 1 October for subsequent Winter meetings.

4. A notice soliciting nominations for the proposed award of the Lectureship shall be invited in the programmes for the Society's meetings, on the Society's website, by email or other communications to Society members.

5. The award of the Lectureship shall be made by the Committee of the Society. In the event of no nominations of sufficient merit being received, the Committee of the Society may: (i) nominate a Wyllie Lectureship and Medallist for that year, or (ii) decide that no award be made.

6. The person chosen as a Wyllie Lecturer and Medallist shall deliver to the next appropriate Scientific Meeting of the Society a lecture of not more than 45 minutes duration on the topic for which the award was made. The abstract of the lecture may be published subsequently in the Society's Journal of Pathology at the discretion of the Editor-in-Chief.

7. The successful nominee will receive registration, travel and hotel expenses and an invitation to attend the Society Dinner.
